Slow-to-cook Sicilian pizza well worth the wait at eatery

MENU

The menu features Italian favorites of all varieties, including pizza, pasta, cold and hot subs and stromboli. Desserts include tiramisu, cannoli, cheesecake, gelato and tartufo.

ATMOSPHERE

Relaxed and friendly. There are plenty of tables outside, where we chose to sit and enjoy a warm fall evening.

OUR FAVORITE FOOD/PRICE

The four of us shared a large Sicilian pepperoni pizza (\$13, plus \$2.50 for the topping), and we barely made a dent. It was delicious and filling. We also shared an order of garlic rolls (\$2 for a half-dozen), fried mozzarella with marinara sauce (\$7.95) and a tossed salad (\$5).

REASON TO GO

The pizza. Our Sicilian took a while to bake, but the wait was well worth it.

SERVICE

Friendly, but somewhat slow.
